

Livs – who were they?

"the indigenous people of Latvia, who little by little, have mixed with Latvians"

10th century;

Livs have their own anthem and flag. The author of the lyrics is Kārlis Stalte, a Livonian poet; The Liv written language started to develop in the middle of 19th century;

Latin alphabet with some additional letters;

A macron above the letter marks the length of a vowel;

The stress falls always on the first syllable



Grizelda Kristina the last speaker who had native fluency in the language.

Died in 2013, in Canada
